



We've all come home from a hard day at work in a daze, and we've all come to work hazy after an exhausting night. Striking the right balance means balancing your energy, as well as your time.

Amit: What skills are required in your position on a day-to-day basis?

Mr. A. Sharma: I require Focus and Self-Control with information overloaded. Perspective taking, Communicating, Making Connections, Critical Thinking, Taking on Challenges, Self-Directed and Engaged Learning.

Amit: What's been your biggest professional challenge thus far and how did you deal with them?

Mr. A. Sharma: Yes, I had some. However, during that time I remain positive. There are times when you need to ask for help and one should not hesitate in doing that. First of all...Look at the challenge from all sides. ...Know when to delegate. ...Set small goals. ...

I faced challenges after receiving a promotion.

I deal as I briefly describe the task/situation how to hand, giving relevant details as needed, explain the actions as used to complete my task or solve the issue.

Amit: How did you meet your life partner? What was your first impression of her? How do you know she is the right one for you?

Mr. A. Sharma: I met my life partner in Jamshedpur through my sister-in-law. She is in her distant relation. The one who was first is still today, she is still superior to me and I have not been able to become worthy of her even today. Everyone moves together. Along with all the household work, she takes full care of the children. The credit for all the successful household chores goes to my wife, while I easily get the credit for all the bad things. If the life partner gives importance to the relations in the house, then the joy of heaven is found in the home itself. My life partner is sensible and cultured, has always supported me in all situations. Today we are very happy & love each others company even after 14 years of marriage. I have two sons Nikhil and Arjun.

Amit: As a member of our community, what do you think the chamber could be doing differently/better?

Mr. A. Sharma: Yes, Jharkhand Chamber can do a lot better in every field along with the economic development of the state. Showing strong willpower to the government, we should be made a participant in every development plan. Along with improving the economy, employment generation, social upliftment, etc., we get to know the ground reality in every field, based on our inputs, the government can do a lot of good work.

Amit: What is the opinion of the people of the Chamber on the problem and solution of Ranchi?

Mr. A. Sharma: Rich in nature and culture, Ranchi is still poor in terms of infrastructure. People are troubled due to lack of water and electricity in summer, water logging in rainy season, struggle for cleanliness throughout the years and traffic problem. About 22 years ago, at the time of formation of the state, there was hope among the people for the solution of the problems, which has not been fulfilled yet. During this time the city continued to expand and continues to grow. The population is also increasing, in front of which the continuous development is getting pale. The Municipal Corporation collects tax but the citizens are not getting the services as per the tax. There is a bad condition of power supply in the name of underground cabling. Announced and undeclared power cuts are emerging as a big problem. All the plans made so far for parking are proving to be insufficient. A solution has to be found for this. We have to take care of how the city looks beautiful. Policy makers need to think towards holistic development.

Amit: What thing made you grow the most, professionally?

Mr. A. Sharma: Think about your existing skills. Try to create a mental list that ranks or categorizes them based on your comfort or skill level. As you build your list, consider:

- > Areas where you need improvement
- ➤ Potential causes of the gaps between success and improvement
- > Skills you use daily
- > Skills you use rarely





Chemicals present in Synthetic / Market products of daily uses Materials and their Long-term Consequences

INTRODUCTION

Time is changing and by riding on this vehicle of change, man has travelled many stages and today he is standing in line for his living in the most advanced developing era i.e. 21st century, where there are fast moving vehicles, almost all the facilities equipped with scientific technology and telecommunication facilities are available. In such a situation, it can be said that today's time is very colourful and relaxed, but is it really so?

This question must have arisen in the mind of almost every human being. Years ago, we learned that the earth is round and that time always repeats itself. In the present context, it can be taken to mean that from where we probably started climbing the first rung of development, wherever we are today and wherever we are going in the name of development, probably again moving towards the first rung of the same development.

Now see, due to the facilities of scientific technology and telecommunication, we are called developed human beings, the same facilities are becoming a problem for all of us today. Whether it is different types of machinery or plant or it is unlimited artificial products of daily use, there is a black shadow of unknown and unfamiliar chemicals at every step. Such Harmful Chemicals are like Cold Warriors, those who are just in name but secretly keep hollowing us out. In fact, all these disruptive chemicals enter the human body mainly through two mediums, which are cosmetic-beauty products and packaged market food items, respectively. If these black shadows of chemicals are started from the things included in the cosmetics of humans (men and women) used daily, then a good base can be started. Shringar-rasa has great glory in human society and all kinds of cosmetics have an important role in maintaining this glory and illusion, which humans have adopted since about 10,000 years before Christ. Yes, keep in mind that in this glow of beauty, we will not only talk about women, because today both men and women are equal partners in maintaining their respective attraction.

TECHNICAL FACTS

Every day, from the time we wake up till we go to bed, we come across a variety of soaps and laundry products, beauty and everyday bath products such as lotions and creams, oils, anti-wrinkle creams, perfumes to remove body odors, eye drops, and eyelash tinting products, artificial blushes for the face, hair shampoo, moisturizing ingredients, various types of gel, hair growth as well as hair removal products and volatile fragrances, artificial lip balms, liquid levelling products, liquid cosmetics, nail care products, men's shaving creams, semiliquid toothpastes, etc. By providing shelter to many types of dangerous chemicals in their own body, they continue to present a unique example of human hosting tradition. Statistics show that globally around 13,000 chemicals are used to make all these types of artificial/synthetic cosmetics and according to the International cooperation and cosmetic regulation, only 10 percent of these chemicals are considered safe for humans.

Micro-chemicals present in cosmetics such as: Benzophenones, di-benzyl methanes, para-amino benzoic acid, cinnamates, coumarin, phthal eugenol, butylate hydroxyanisole, butylate hydroxytoluene, petrolatum, paraben, sodium lauryl sulfate, etc. cause cancer in humans) are the main factors of the disease. In particular, polyethylene glycol and butylate hydroxytoluene act as a copy of the female sex hormone oestrogen, inhibiting the activation of the male sex hormone, due to which there is a strong possibility of serious problems like impotence in men.Almost all types of cosmetics contain 96% lead, 90% beryllium, 61% thallium, 51% cadmium and 20% arsenic, which affect women's menstrual cycle and reduce their ability to conceive. In such a situation, we have to think about how much we will be able to enhance our beauty by using these artificial cosmetics.

Man-made cosmetic products also include a variety of soaps and cleaning products, which are a form of detergent. According to one record, India consumes about 40,000 tons of laundry detergent every year. Apart from this, the consumption of liquid detergents to keep clothes smelling, soft and to remove various stains is about 13,10,000 tonnes per year. Many hazardous & harmful chemicals like thiazolinones, bronopol, formaldehyde, methyl diacetic acid, nitrilon tri-acetate acid, benzalkonium chloride, ethylene diamine tetraacetate, different types of enzymes, phosphates and catalysts etc. are found in these soaps and laundry products. Such chemicals can affect not only our skin but also the kidney, liver, intestine, heart, etc. along with the new generations to come.

CONCLUSIVE NOTE

Keeping pace with the changing times, mankind today aspires to fulfil his every happiness and sorrow with the help of artificiality, be it "only" beautification or food: Modernity is everywhere. We are all passing through the chemical age of the 21st century and it is probably difficult to escape its effects. 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
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
