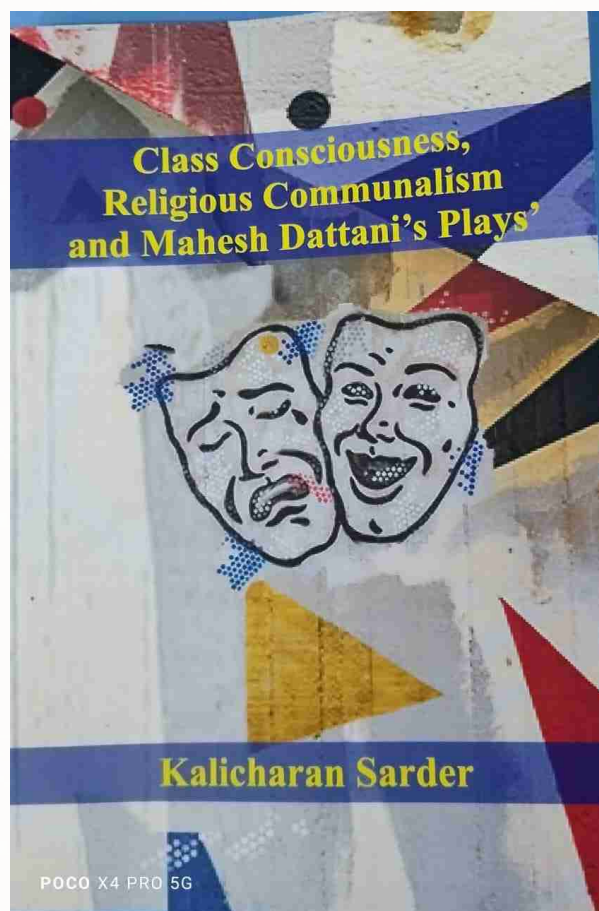

Literature vs Science

For years, there has been debate over Imagination vs. Practicability, that is, the supposed boundary between Literature and Science is long withstanding. In every way they differ and fail to find common ground, yet there is similarity. Both develop thinking. It is not about how we think; it is about how you are made to think and believe makes you different. Both Literature and Science refine and polish the mental capability. They change individual's perception about the world he/she inhabits.

Literature as we all know handles the symbolic medium of language. Besides, being the most elusive of the arts, it is also the most inclusive. A concern with individual's inner life; his passions, his feelings, his thoughts is the distinguishing character of literature. Here, we look especially not for the fact or logic but for human emotion and feelings, the play of imagination, the discipline of thought as revealed in the beauty of form.

Science is the pursuit and application of knowledge and understanding of the natural and social world following a systematic methodology based on evidence.

Witnessing the definition, one can easily interpret that Literature & Science are two poles of a magnet. However, I find that both are products of one's observation and experience. Literature is engendered when a creative imagination is at work and Science is engendered when a curious imagination is at work. Both develop a need to collect diverse thoughts and reorganize evaluations. In other words, this can be clarified as: Literature which happens to be a beautiful subject seems to charmingly condition the thought processes of the individuals who own it. And, Science which happens to be emblematic of all practicability nurtures one's mind and engenders a yearning to learn and discover more.

Moreover, I find that the mental capability that make us understand literary pieces, are the same that make us comprehend scientific discourse. Mental capability consist of individual's observation and experience, which helps in grasping the creative imagination of Literature as well as the signs, symbols and theories in Science. I wonder sharing so many similarities, both Literature & Science are howsoever, kept against each other.

In addition to the above fact, one inhales experience over a course of time and exhales Literature. This is the reason why most pieces of Literature are too close to reality; the characters are organic and pulsate with life. In a similar condition, one inhales curiosity and exhales symbols and theories that satiate the queries to know the undiscovered truth behind. The only difference between the two, I find, however is the way in which they are penned down, a matter of mere academics.

Moving forward, I find that there was no distinction between the two during the Middle Ages. The literary works of the period reflect some thought provoking remarks, such as, the works of Chaucer and Dante. The Scientific Revolution, the beginning of the divide saw Galileo fight his contemporaries and the Church on the nature of our Solar System. This famous scientist employed rhetoric, the realm of that of literature to sway his audience and to prove his case. The reverse is also seen; such as the presence of astrology in Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales* where the Wife of Bath credits her energy to her 'constellation'.

However, until the introduction of scientific instruments like microscopes and telescopes, observable phenomena like- tree, storm etc were more or less the same for all observers regardless of the epistemological framework they possessed. With the introduction of microscope and telescope a new problem of scale emerged. The scientists now had access to objects that were beyond the human scale. Thus, from the 17th cen. a basic division arose. Science moved on to deal with what was immense and minute, that is, astronomy and micro science became exclusive spheres of scientific knowledge whereas; the subjective was restricted almost exclusively to Literature.

Next, I find that language of poetry already exists in Science. Metaphors are characteristic of poetry, often described as 'flowery language'. It is a tool for imagery, but is not restricted to poetic device. Metaphors can be thought of as analogies and in the case of Science, this is quite useful. In Science, analogies (metaphors) are used to bridge the gap in language. Models are also a form of metaphor. The Bohr model of atom was based on the Solar System, thus a metaphor. The model stated above is a vital component of Physics and understanding Atomic Theory.

Without poetic language, this knowledge would be nearly incomprehensible. Giving thought to this point, Science then becomes an interpretation of reality and its characteristic language the tool for conceptualizing discovery and breakthroughs. In a nutshell, it can be said that Science as a source of images, metaphors or explanatory devices is quiet an obvious interaction between Science and Literature, and yet often overlooked.

Each discipline exerts a unique influence on the other in terms of its complexities and concerns. Isaac Newton would not have been alive in history as a mathematical genius had he not been curious within his disposition. What drove his curiosity to the level of exploring from merely attentive observation of a falling apple was the force of imagination itself. Likewise, it was the same imagination that helped Ibsen carve his evaluations and analysis about the state of affairs of his society, through the infrastructure of his drama. Moreover, the various psychoanalytic complexes being applied to the prolific writer- D.H. Lawrence works is material enough to create the realization that Literature and Science do have the features to coincide in some space without bounds.

Both disciplines can be taken together as educational resource, in a way that goes beyond cross-disciplinarity into applied inter-disciplinarity to let the individuals explore and elevate themselves by enlightening their mind.

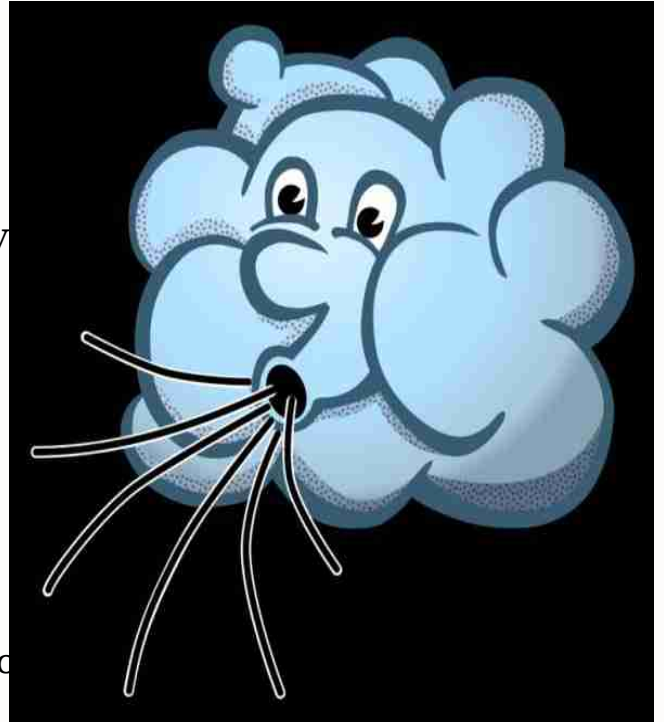

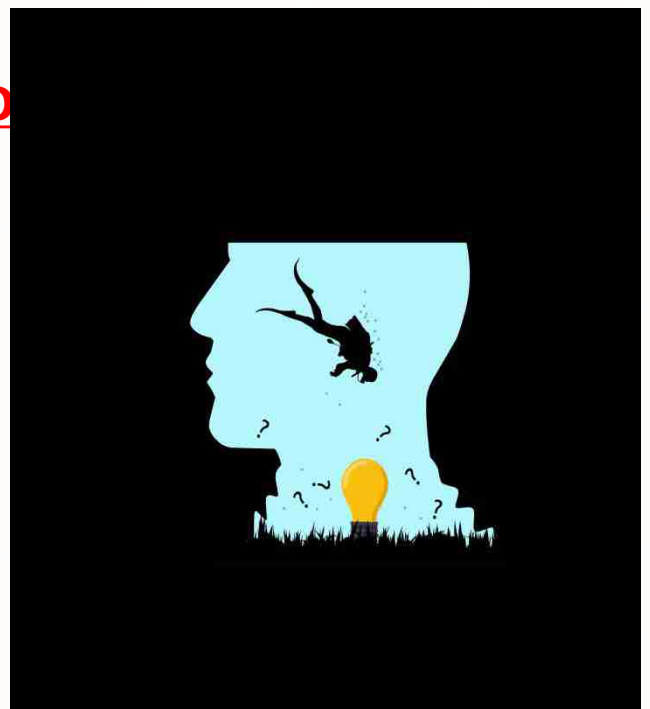

Current estimations show that at around the same time that agriculture was beginning to develop and thrive, the population of our ancestors started to double at a rate that was far higher than what it had been previously for the more than 2 million years of prior human existence. What does this then mean, and what does it say about humans and their attitude towards the environment? This hinges largely on the viewpoints to which we allow ourselves to be open.

The most common view taken is that most (if not all) technologies we create mark an “advance” for humankind. Perhaps because they are prized so much either for their practical or symbolic value, it has become difficult to regard the technologies without a bias towards their immediate effects on human society as opposed to the overall compatibility with the rest of the natural world. Within this mindset, it is very hard to put aside the very “advanced” tools that seem to form the foundation of what a complicated, sophisticated, intelligent human is supposed to be. In this light, a complex process like agriculture cannot be anything but an advance, and any lifestyle that dates prior to the agricultural advent must, by subtle implication, be inferior. This inference is so heavily interwoven into modern human culture that even the critics of our environmentally incompatible ways have trouble filtering away the prejudices that are so prevalent in human cultures as we know them.

So if not an evolution, is agriculture by default a devolution? It may not be helpful to look at it in such black or white terms. It is equivalent to asking whether a hammer is an evil tool. When used properly, no, but otherwise, it can be. It is essentially up to us humans to use a tool responsibly, and ideally, if the tool introduces more problems than it solves, to simply stop using said tool.

What is worrisome is that modern humans (meaning people who continue to use and/or promote technologies even when they cause much damage, whether to humans themselves or to the rest of the world's life) do not seem to do this. Such people seem too stimulated by the technologies we created, from market economy and weapons of mass destruction to the simpler-scale household appliances. This suggests that many do not really see the frictions such technologies impose on our surroundings as problems, but rather according to their perception of the way things are, the tools they use are only doing exactly what they were supposed to and it cannot be helped. And moreover, this is so ingrained in most modern human cultures that the constituents of said cultures do not even see a problem with that.

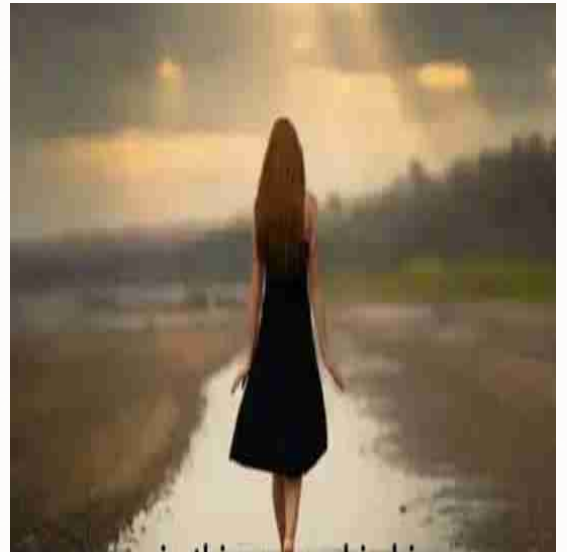
