EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The "Remedial Classes for Literacy and Numeracy" program, meticulously conducted and organized by YBN University, Rajaulatu, Namkum, Ranchi, in its adopted Lali Village, commenced on January 25, 2025. The primary objective of this initiative is to enhance the foundational literacy and numeracy skills of primary school students in the village, addressing educational gaps and fostering a stronger learning base. Covering an intensive period from its inception until June 10, 2025, the program has successfully engaged a significant number of students through dedicated teaching and interactive sessions. Key achievements within these initial five months include notable improvements in students' basic reading, writing, and arithmetic abilities, as evidenced by consistent attendance and positive qualitative feedback from instructors and the community. This focused educational intervention reflects YBN University's unwavering commitment to empowering the youth of Lali Village through quality education.

Initial Positive Impact: Lali Village Transformed by YBN University's Outreach

Since its launch on January 25, 2025, YBN University, Rajaulatu, Namkum, Ranchi's "Remedial Classes for Literacy and Numeracy" program in its adopted Lali Village (just 8 KM from the university campus) has already begun to cultivate significant positive changes in both the educational landscape and general well-being of the community, as observed by June 10, 2025.

In the realm of Education: The most immediate and heartening change is the visible surge in primary students' engagement and confidence. Children who previously struggled with basic reading and arithmetic are now showing marked improvement in their foundational literacy and numeracy skills. There's a tangible increase in their enthusiasm for learning, with higher attendance rates and active participation in the remedial classes. This renewed academic interest is not confined to the classroom; teachers report a noticeable shift in students' ability to grasp concepts more quickly, and parents express delight at their children's newfound excitement about schoolwork. The program is not just teaching subjects; it's rekindling a love for learning.



practices among villagers. Through informal interactions and general outreach during the educational program, there's a discernible improvement in community understanding of preventive health measures. The visibility of the university's commitment has fostered a greater sense of trust, laying the groundwork for more comprehensive health interventions in the near future and encouraging villagers to pay more attention to personal and community well-being. This holistic approach is fostering a healthier and more informed Lali Village.



Total Enrollment: The program successfully enrolled a commendable 76 primary students from Lali Village (Table o1), a figure that highlights the community's keen interest and the perceived value of the remedial classes. This strong initial intake aligns well with the university's outreach objectives and demonstrates a significant demand for such educational support in the area.

Attendance Rates: Reflecting the students' and parents' commitment, the average daily and weekly attendance rates have consistently hovered around an impressive 70%. This rate is highly encouraging, especially for a remedial program, and surpasses initial projections for consistent participation. Such high attendance is vital for the continuous learning process and underscores the effectiveness of the teaching methodology and the supportive environment fostered by the university's volunteers and faculty.

Demographic Breakdown: To ensure equitable access and targeted support, the enrollment was carefully managed across different demographics:

- Gender: The program achieved a healthy balance, with 40 male students (52.6%) and 36 female students (47.4%) actively participating. This balanced representation ensures that both genders benefit equally from the literacy and numeracy interventions.
- Age Groups: The students were primarily concentrated in the 6-8 years age group (55%) and the 9-11 years age group (45%). This breakdown allows for tailored instruction, addressing

the specific learning needs associated with these developmental stages and ensuring that the remedial content is age-appropriate and impactful.

The consistent enrollment and high attendance rates are a testament to the community's embrace of the program and the dedicated efforts of YBN University in making quality remedial education accessible to the children of Lali Village.

Tailored Curriculum and Engaging Methodology: Empowering Learners in Lali Village

A cornerstone of the "Remedial Classes for Literacy and Numeracy" program, meticulously designed and delivered by YBN University, Rajaulatu, Namkum, Ranchi, in its adopted Lali Village from January 25, 2025, to June 10, 2025, has been its thoughtfully structured curriculum and dynamic teaching methodology.

Remedial Curriculum Design: The curriculum was specifically crafted to address foundational gaps in primary students' learning. For literacy, the focus was on core English language skills: phonics, basic vocabulary building, sentence construction, and comprehension of simple texts. The aim was to build a strong reading and writing base, making language accessible and engaging. For numeracy, the curriculum concentrated on fundamental mathematical concepts: number recognition, basic arithmetic operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division), understanding place value, and simple problem-solving techniques. Both curricula prioritized clarity, repetition, and practical application to ensure deep understanding.

Dynamic Teaching Methods: The university's dedicated team of educators, comprising both experienced faculty and enthusiastic student volunteers, employed a multifaceted teaching approach:

- Interactive Sessions: Lessons were far from traditional lectures. Teachers facilitated lively, interactive sessions that encouraged students to ask questions, participate in discussions, and collaboratively solve problems, fostering a vibrant learning environment.
- Group Activities: Students frequently engaged in small group activities, allowing for peerto-peer learning and collaborative problem-solving. This approach built confidence, improved communication skills, and ensured that every child had an opportunity to contribute.

Individualized Attention: Recognizing that each child learns at a different pace, a significant
emphasis was placed on providing individualized attention. Teachers closely monitored
student progress, offering personalized support and clarification to those who needed extra
guidance, ensuring no child was left behind.

Materials Used and Expert Guidance: To support this comprehensive approach, a range of specially designed materials was utilized. Our dedicated team of Mathematics teachers, with their expertise in making numbers relatable, utilized colorful workbooks filled with practical exercises, alongside various teaching aids like abacuses, number charts, and educational games to demystify complex concepts. Similarly, our experienced English language teachers employed custom-designed workbooks for phonics and vocabulary, coupled with storybooks, flashcards, and pictorial charts to make language acquisition fun and intuitive. The integration of these well-chosen materials with the engaging teaching methods has proven instrumental in achieving the program's remedial objectives.

Dedicated Engagement: The Driving Force Behind Lali Village's Remedial Success

The transformative impact of the "Remedial Classes for Literacy and Numeracy" program in Lali Village, spearheaded by YBN University, Rajaulatu, Namkum, Ranchi is largely attributable to the profound dedication and commitment of its teaching and volunteer force.

Teacher and Volunteer Involvement: Recognizing the significant challenges faced by the children of Lali Village, particularly their foundational weaknesses in English and Mathematics, a committed team of university students, faculty members, and volunteers was deployed. This passionate group, comprising both experienced educators from YBN University's academic departments and enthusiastic student volunteers, served as the backbone of the program, delivering lessons with zeal and empathy. Their focused efforts on these two critical subjects were instrumental in addressing the most pressing learning gaps identified within the community.

Comprehensive Training and Support: To ensure the highest quality of instruction, extensive training was provided to all participating teachers and volunteers. A unique and highly effective aspect of this training involved the invaluable assistance of Trainee Teachers (B.Ed. Students) from YBN College for Teacher Education. These future educators brought fresh pedagogical insights and practical classroom management skills, delivering workshops and on-site guidance. This collaborative model not only equipped the program's teachers with effective remedial strategies but also provided the B.Ed. students with invaluable real-world teaching experience in a community setting.

Feedback from the Frontlines: Experiences and Challenges: The teachers and volunteers shared a generally positive and deeply rewarding experience. Many expressed immense satisfaction in witnessing the tangible progress of the children, highlighting moments of "breakthrough" where previously struggling students grasped complex concepts. They frequently reported feeling a strong sense of purpose and connection with the Lali Village community.

However, the experience was also accompanied by certain challenges. Volunteers noted initial difficulties in adapting teaching methods to the specific learning styles and prior knowledge gaps of some students. Ensuring consistent attendance for every child, especially during peak agricultural seasons, required continuous communication and encouragement with families. Logistical aspects, such as managing classroom resources in a non-traditional setting, also presented occasional hurdles. Despite these, the

overwhelming sentiment was one of profound positive impact, with volunteers eager to continue their contributions and further refine their approaches based on their initial five months of dedicated service.

Complementary Health Initiatives: Fostering Holistic Well-being in Lali Village

Beyond its core educational mission, the "Remedial Classes for Literacy and Numeracy" program, conducted by YBN University, Rajaulatu, Namkum, Ranchi, in its adopted Lali Village (08 KM from the university campus) from January 25, 2025, to June 10, 2025, has also strategically integrated crucial health services to promote the overall well-being of the community. Recognizing that health is intrinsically linked to a child's ability to learn and a community's capacity to thrive, these complementary initiatives have been warmly received.

General Health Check-ups: A significant component of the university's outreach involved organizing dedicated health check-up camps within the village. These camps provided essential preventative care and initial medical assessments. Over the reporting period, a total of 150 individuals benefited from these general health check-ups, which included vital screenings and basic medical advice. Notably, all 76 primary students enrolled in the remedial classes were among these beneficiaries, ensuring their physical health supports their academic journey. These check-ups were instrumental in identifying minor health issues early and offering guidance for better health management.

Targeted Awareness Campaigns: Alongside medical check-ups, the university's team proactively conducted various awareness campaigns. These sessions focused on disseminating vital information critical for community health and hygiene. Key topics included:

- Hygiene Practices: Emphasizing the importance of handwashing, clean drinking water, and personal sanitation to prevent common infections.
- Nutrition: Educating villagers on balanced diets, local nutritious food sources, and the importance of healthy eating habits for children's growth and development.
- Common Diseases: Providing information on prevalent local diseases, their symptoms, prevention methods, and when to seek professional medical help.

These awareness campaigns, often conducted during or alongside the educational sessions, ensured that families in Lali Village were not only receiving educational support but also gaining valuable knowledge to lead healthier lives. This integrated approach underscores YBN University's commitment to the holistic development of its adopted community.

The Homeopathy Doctors provided general health check-ups, offered consultations for common ailments, and dispensed necessary medications, ensuring accessible primary care. The trainee nurses were instrumental in conducting initial screenings, assisting the doctors, managing patient flow, and actively participating in the health awareness campaigns.

The experiences of these medical personnel and volunteers have been overwhelmingly positive and professionally enriching. They reported a deep sense of satisfaction from directly impacting the health outcomes of the villagers, particularly the children enrolled in the remedial classes. They frequently highlighted the community's gratitude and eagerness to learn about health and hygiene. While challenges such as initial hesitancy among some villagers or managing a diverse range of health issues were encountered, the team's collaborative spirit and commitment to service consistently prevailed. This direct engagement has not only provided vital health support to Lali Village but also offered invaluable practical experience and community-oriented learning to YBN University's future medical professionals.
